Oxford Bach Soloists

The Oxford Bach Soloists (OBS) was founded by Tom Hammond-Davies (Artistic Director) in 2015. It is a Baroque ensemble whose ambition is to perform, in sequence, the complete canon of JS Bach's vocal works over 12 years. Their mission is distinctive and pioneering: while there have been many recordings and performances of the complete vocal works of Bach, no ensemble has ever mounted a cycle of performances in chronological order, programmed in real-time, and in the context for which they were conceived.

The aim is to perform Bach's works as he himself would have realised them with performers, instruments, and venues that echo the university and churches of Bach's hometown of Leipzig. The regular performances take place in New College Oxford, one Sunday afternoon per month with additional special performances at Christmas and Easter.

The Oxford Bach Soloists are scheduled to perform the St John Passion for TBS in Farnham on Saturday 27 March 2021.
