Trio Lalique

Ilya Kondratiev is a critically acclaimed pianist and prize-winner of several renowned international competitions, including Franz Liszt Budapest 2011, Franz Liszt Weimar 2011, the Fifth Tbilisi 2013, Brant Birmingham 2015, and the Chappell Gold Medal in 2016. Born in Russia, he began his musical studies at age seven in Samara and continued at the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory before relocating to London in 2014 to further his studies at the Royal College of Music, where he completed a Master of Performance and Artist Diploma. Ilya performs widely as both a soloist and chamber musician at major venues such as the Great Hall of the Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory, Gasteig Munich, and Palacio de Festivales de Santander, and he is a professor of piano at the Royal College of Music in London.

Yuri Kalnits is a violinist recognised for his rich tone and distinguished chamber music career. A recipient of two prestigious *Diapason d'Or* awards for his recording of Weinberg's Violin Sonatas, he has appeared at international festivals across Europe, the USA, and Asia, and in major concert venues including The Purcell Room, King's Place, St. John's Smith Square, and Suntory Hall in Tokyo. Born in Moscow, Yuri began his musical training with his father and continued at the Central Music School and Gnessin Music School before studying at the Royal College of Music in London on major scholarships. As a concerto soloist he has performed with orchestras such as the London Festival Orchestra and Novosibirsk Symphony Orchestra, and he co-directs the London concert series *ChamberMusicBox* with cellist Julia Morneweg.

Julia Morneweg is a London-based cellist, soloist, chamber musician, and artistic curator whose concert career spans the UK, Europe and the USA. The recipient of an EMI Music Foundation Award, she made her London concerto debut in 2006 performing Elgar's Cello Concerto at St John's Smith Square and has since appeared with orchestras and in recital venues including the Purcell Room, Oxford's Holywell Music Rooms, Trieste Opera House, and the Tacoma International Music Festival. Prior to joining Trio Lalique in 2022, she spent eleven years as cellist of the Erato Piano Trio and has collaborated with leading musicians worldwide; she is also joint Artistic Director of *ChamberMusicBox* and an experienced teacher and masterclass presenter. Julia trained at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater Hannover and the Royal College of Music in London, and performs on an exceptional 1882 Charles Boullangier cello.
