Sofía Ros

Spanish accordionist **Sofía Ros** is rapidly establishing herself as one of the leading voices of her generation. In 2025, she was named BBC Radio Scotland Young Classical Musician of the Year, following her solo debut with the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra

She appeared as a soloist with the Concerto Orchestra of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, after winning First Prize in the institution's 2024 Concerto Competition.

Sofía has performed at major international venues such as Carnegie Hall in New York, Musikverein and Konzerthaus in Vienna, Purcell Room in London, Queen's Hall in Edinburgh, and the Altes Rathaus in Vienna.

Beyond the concert stage, Sofía is deeply committed to educational outreach. During a recent tour of Texas, she led workshops in underserved schools, and as part of Live Music Now Scotland, she regularly performs in hospitals, care homes, and community centres.

Born in the Canary Islands, she began playing the accordion at the age of five. At thirteen, she earned a full scholarship to study at St. Mary's Music School in Edinburgh, receiving the Director's Recital Prize in 2020. She is currently based in Glasgow, studying with Djordje Gajic at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. Her development has been supported by the ABRSM EU Undergraduate Scholarship, Craxton Memorial Trust, Drake Calleja Trust, Talent Unlimited, and Help Musicians UK

Sofía performs on a Pignini Sirius Compact bayan, handcrafted in Castelfidardo, Italy.
